Establishments are public and private firms and their employees(excluding the factories owned by the Ministry of National Defense, consumers cooperatives, workshops of schools, relief institutions and prisons). Personnel shall be sent on location for the purposes of survey by mail and interview, as well as by the Internet.

The number of employees is used as a variable of stratification. The Dalenius-Hodges approximate optimum method is used to determine the boundaries between strata and the Nyman best allocation method in each stratum. In principle, the survey period of every sample is confined to one year. The source of data for population is the population files of the latest Industry, Commerce and Service Census. The samples of industrial sub- classifications not exceeding 5 units should be increased to 5 units, and the population of less than 5 units all should be surveyed.
